Our sportsmen excelled this week, in hockey, rugby and football, not forgetting the Pre-Prep who have been working on the bat hold prior to the cricket season.


I look forward to seeing as many of you as possible tomorrow at the Litter Pick and St John's Association Quiz.














#### Year 6 visit the Natural History Museum














#### Year 8 Astronomy






#### Red Nose Day brings the whole school together

Aary in Year 7 organised a very popular charity waffle sale at first break on Wednesday and raised £200 for our School Charity.








