

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












Showcasing connections in Science




Year 8 exploring Biodiversity at Kew Gardens

They were fascinated by a Biodiversity workshop which focused on the alarming decrease in the variety of plants and animals on our planet and looked at ways to understand these losses. There was also a chance to explore some of the historic greenhouses with their ancient and rare tropical plants.


Using Literature in a Debating Forum

















All about Easter in the Pre-Prep






The Juniors have posted hand-made post cards


