A visit to our School Charity - City Harvest

This week seven boys went to the City Harvest warehouse in Acton Park to see the operation in action. We were fortunate to be shown around by Sarah Calcutt, the CEO of City Harvest. We learned that this organisation delivers an amazing 132,000 meals every week to Londoners. While their current system is already quite orderly and efficient, they have planned for an even more efficient system, which allows less food to be wasted and more food to be delivered even quicker. This change involves two processes, the first one is making more space and having less costly yet more useful storage systems, the second is training more drivers to drive their newest and largest lorry to allow them to have it collecting and delivering 7 days a week. This year they are aiming to raise £5,500,000 which will be hard, but with our School's contributions and many other charitable organisations they will be able to achieve this goal.
