Excellent 13+ and 11+ senior school transfer results



We are very pleased to report that both our Year 8 and Year 6 boys have performed impressively in transfer examinations to senior schools. All our Year 8 boys have been offered places at a school of their choice for September 2023 and our Year 6 boys have successfully secured a place for September 2023 or have won deferred entry places for 2025. Boys in both year groups were offered a total of twenty scholarships reflecting their individual talents and showing how hard they have worked to prepare for the examinations.

Year 8

Whilst Merchant Taylors' continues to be the destination for the largest number of St John's pupils transferring at Year 8, it is gratifying to see that our boys are moving on to ten quality independent senior schools. This clearly demonstrates the high academic achievements of the boys and the excellent quality of the teaching they receive as highlighted in our recent inspection. Kabir performed exceptionally well in winning one of the highly prized King's Scholarships to Westminster School where he also secured a Music exhibition. There were well-deserved academic awards for Kian, Archie and Mihir from Merchant Taylors'.

On the creative and sports sides St John's continues to thrive across the curriculum with Merchant Taylors' Music scholarships for Rafi and Krish and an MTS Sport scholarship for Shane. Emerson, another talented sportsman, was offered Sports scholarships by both John Lyon and St Margaret's and our first golf scholarship was won by George L also from St Margaret's.
