


First days in the D&T workshop for Year 3

Year 3 took another big step into the main school this week with a first visit to the D&T studio where they learned use some tools.
















Inspirational ideas in Art

Entries are now welcome from pupils and staff across the school for the Merchant Taylors' Company Photography Competition.


This year's theme is **POWER** and photographs should be accompanied by a title and, if you wish, a short description (of 12 words maximum).
