








### Exploring the Merchant Taylors' treasures





The Year 6 boys have been hard at work creating their vibrant mosaic tables. They have also been developing their nail and string art projects, showcasing both creativity and craftsmanship.









# London Regional Athletics

On Monday 9th June, St John's hosted the 54th London Regional Prep Schools' Athletics Championship at Eton, Windsor. Ten of our boys qualified to participate in this prestigious event, which involved 40 London-based Prep schools. Athletes who place 1st or 2nd are selected to compete in the National Finals at the renowned Alexander Stadium in Birmingham. Our boys performed exceptionally well, with our best result this year being a 6th place finish. The standard of competition was incredibly high, with no fewer than 14 regional records broken - some of which had stood since 1975.

















## A fantastic week of cricket





The boys played in the U10 Lamb Trophy at Merchant Taylors'. We started the day in the Julian Hill Cricket Centre with a session run by MTS staff and cricketers. The team developed well throughout the day, in a tough group, and finished with a dominating win.
