


Fascinating Year 6 IPQ presentations

We made our own bird beaks to learn about Natural Selection. Will our beaks be the right shape to be able to access the food source?










St John's Charity Day



Mapping the School challenge for Year 1



We were excited to announce the winners of the House Art Competition during Monday's assembly. Congratulations to all our talented winners, what an incredibly gifted group of boys we have!






















