They also saw the Coronation Chair and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. The Year 6 and 8 boys represented St John's impeccably.

Alone after Sunday School in the church hall I stood on tiptoes, poked my finger through the toasted crust and hooked out the plain white flesh – I wanted to taste

the words of the hymn, I wanted to feast on food made only of summer and rain.


The soup tasting was very popular this week

Great collaboration in Year 1


