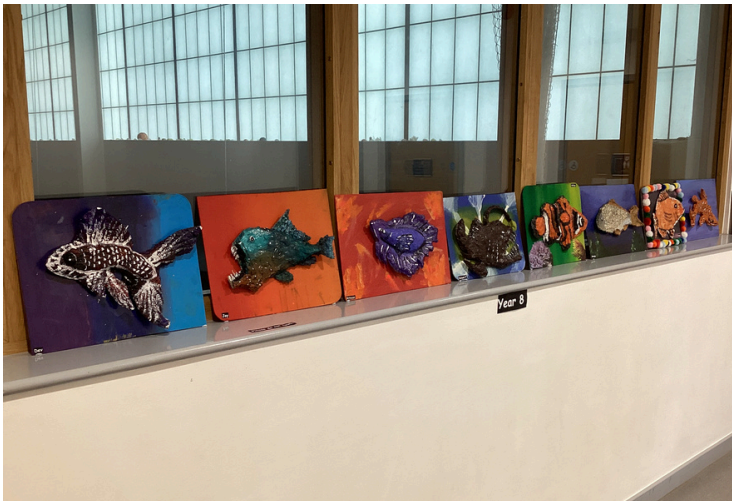
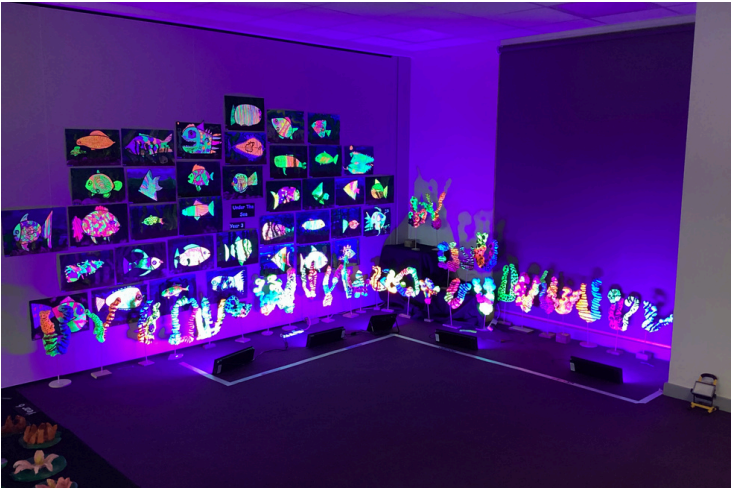






# Showcasing our Art

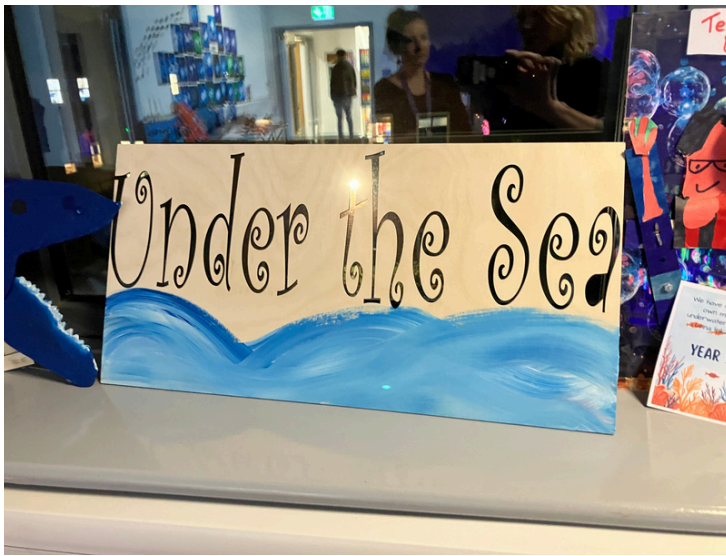

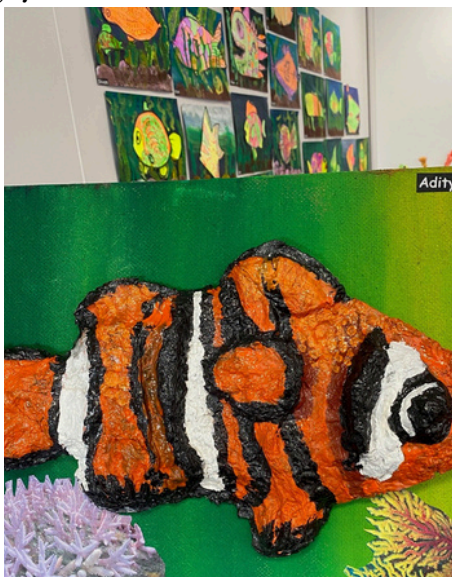

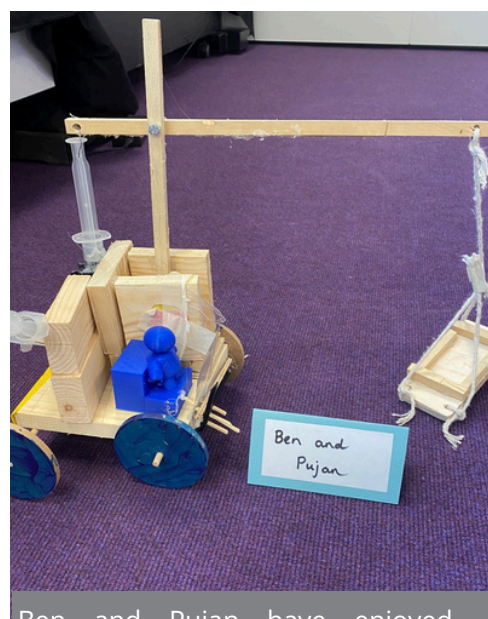
This clownfish by Aditya has been finished to perfection. I like the texture he has created on the fish's body and I love how he has chosen colourful coral to complete the piece.

# VIEW THE NIGHT SKY FROM RUISLIP LIDO

Once again the West of London Astronomical Society  
invites you to observe the Moon and stars.

**Friday 28th Nov - Sunday 30th Nov 2025.**  
**Time 6.00 pm to 8.00 pm.**

If the sky is clear the quarter Moon will be well placed along with Uranus and Saturn whose rings are nearly edge-on. The Andromeda Galaxy, Seven Sisters and Double Cluster are amongst the many other objects in the sky.

Bring family and friends to this FREE event - members of WOLAS will be on hand with a variety of their telescopes and will be able to answer any questions you may have.

Don't forget to wear warm clothing, and bring a torch. To avoid dazzling observers, please limit the brightness of your torch to your phone's light or equivalent and point it down when on site.

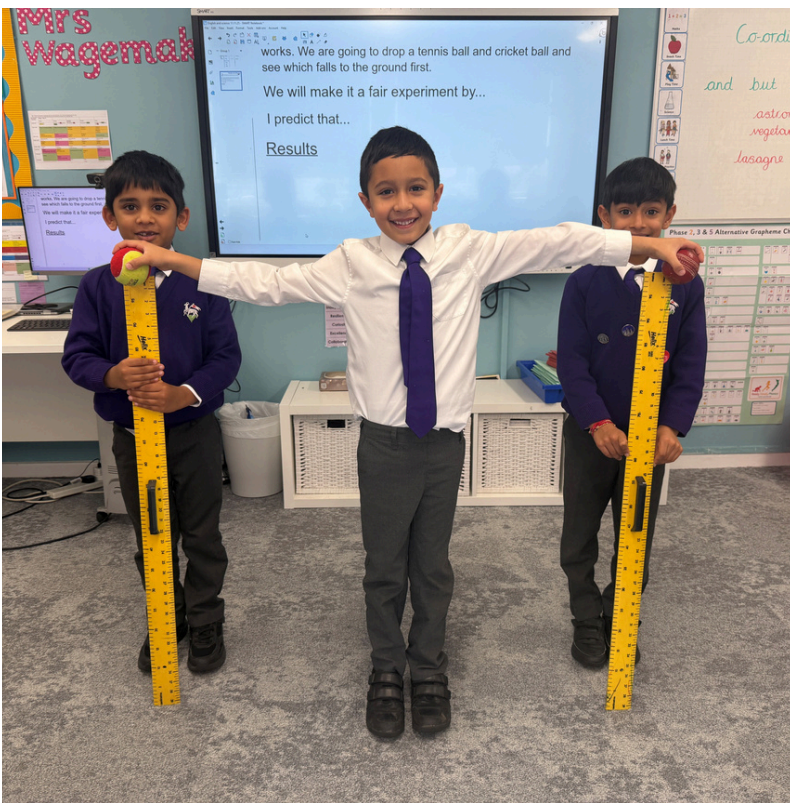

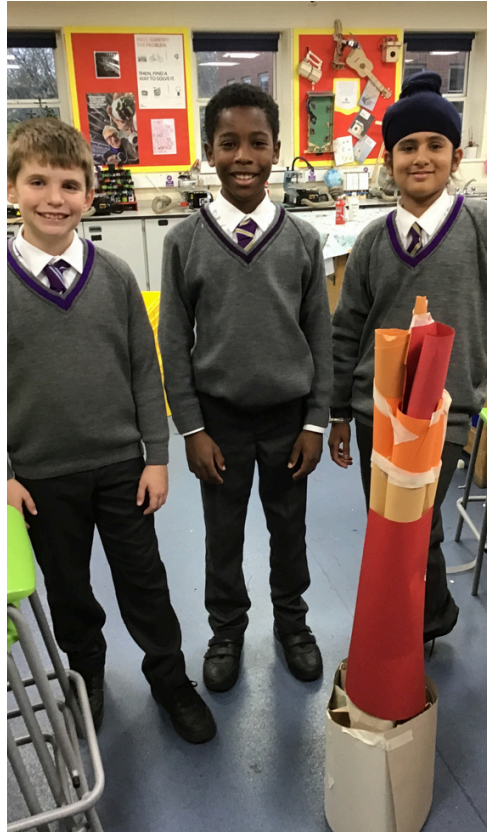
