







PRE-PREP





Year 2 carefully looked up new words in their dictionaries this week.




The Deputy Head's Award for Excellent Presentation this week goes to Saami in the Eagles for his beautifully written setting description based on the picture below from "The Bog Baby."





Keep brushing Year 4!






