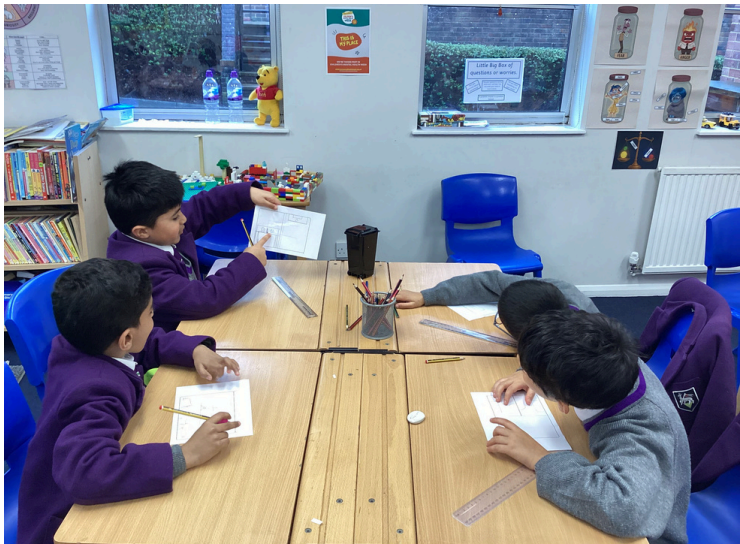

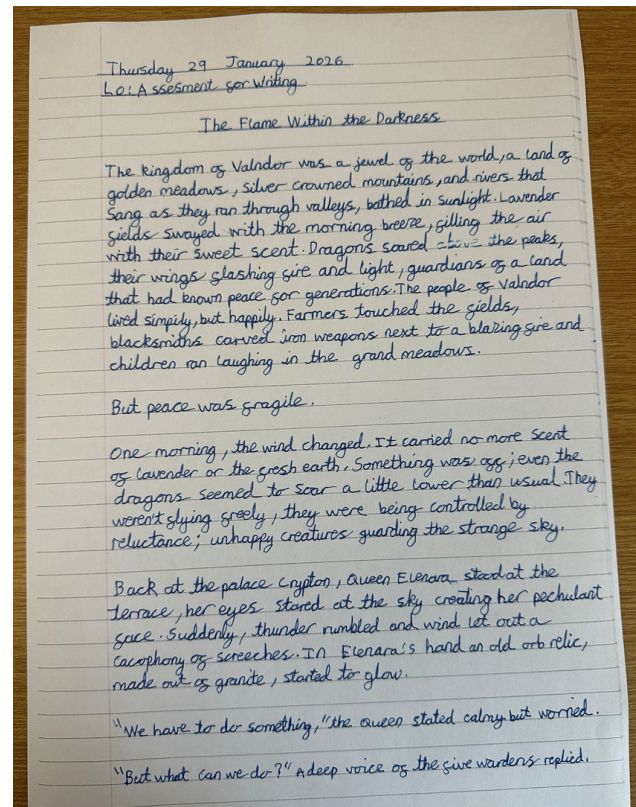

“Spreading the love” in Nursery

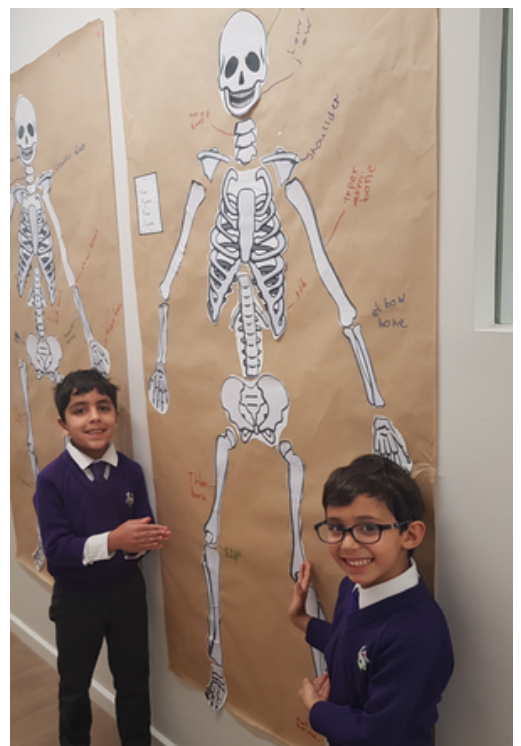

Learning about Lunar New Year

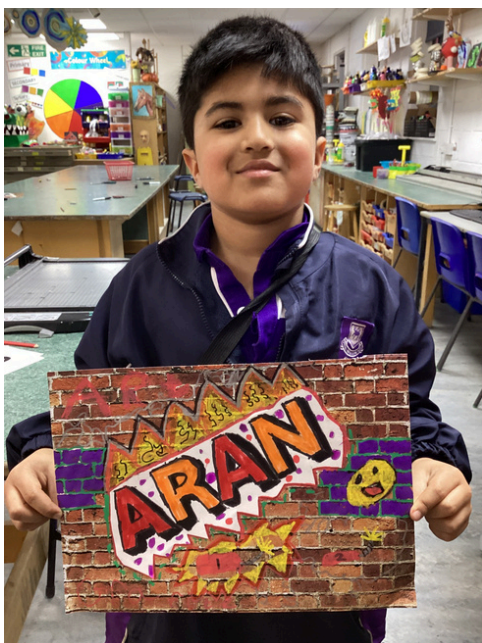

Observing life carefully in the Art Room

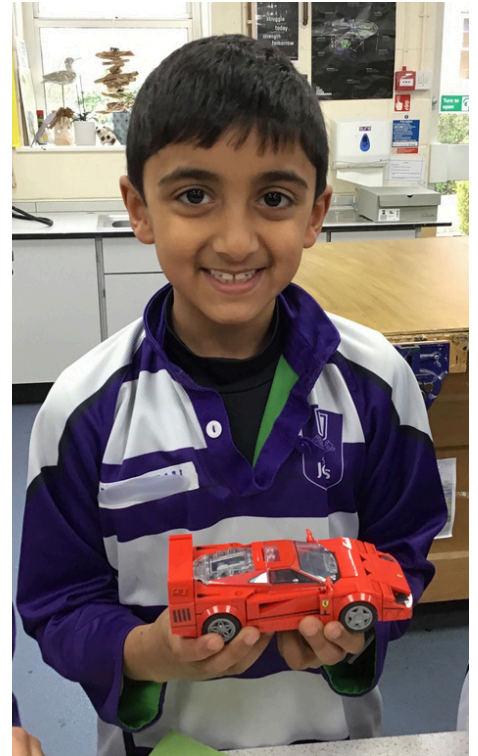
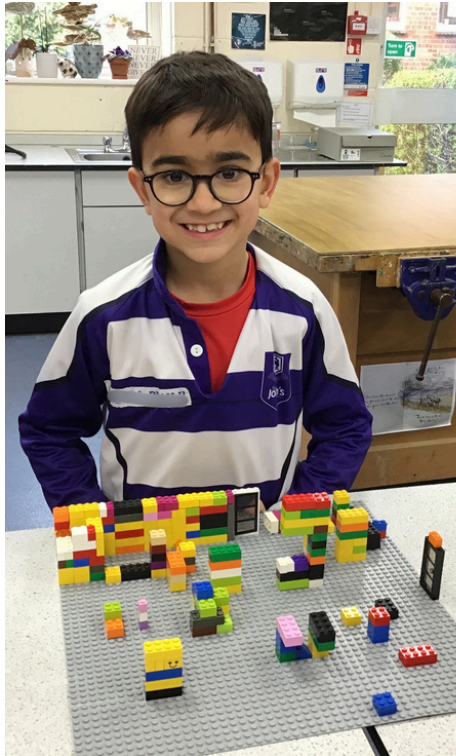
